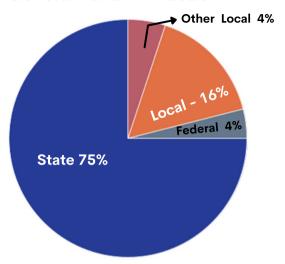

General Fund - FY 2020



Buildings & Grounds

Our Maintenance & Custodial Staff...

Transportation

Our staff of 74 drivers and guest drivers drive 53 bus routes plus activity and field trips.

Each year they drive almost **1 million miles** providing morning, afternoon, and other rides for more than 2,400 students.
