

9th Grade Registration Guide

Registration will be Tuesday, Feb. 11th, at RJEMS during the school day.

As you prepare for high school, here are some guidelines to consider in choosing your classes.

- > There are 7 hours in the school day.
- English, Social, Math, and Science will take 4 hours of your day.
- > 1 semester = half year = 1/2 credit
- > Some classes are only 1 semester long while others are 2 semesters (a full year) a full year course has 2 numbers; one for each semester. You need to register for both semesters of a full year course!

Before you register:

- Decide if you want to take a world language (German or Spanish), band, and/or choir. <u>Each</u> of these options has <u>2</u> numbers (one for semester 1 and one for semester 2) because they are <u>full year courses</u>.
- All 9th grade students will have "Freshman Seminar" semester 1. This is added to your schedule later you do not need to enter a number. This hour is a study hall 4 days/week and provides academic and counselor lessons one day each week. If you want a study hall semester 2, request only 6 credits for the year; that will leave another hour empty to be filled with a study hall.
- Sometimes your first choice will be full and you will not get it on your schedule. (You will get into English, Social, Math, Science, and, if you choose it, Band/Choir.) In order to get a complete schedule, you should choose a few alternate choices. The alternate choices (not to be confused with "elective" credits or choices see page 3 of this guide) will only be considered if one of your first choices is full.



Class Options

You will need 4 credits in English to graduate - that's a full year, every year.

English:

- English 9 #1005 & 2005
 - or
- Advanced English 9 #1006 & 2006

You will need 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ credits in Social Studies to graduate.

Social is 1 semester of Civics <u>and</u> 1 semester of Geography – you must take both.

- Civics #1101 or Advanced Civics #1400 (choose one)
- **Geography 9 #1100** or Advanced Geography 9 #1103 (choose one)

You must have <u>3 credits</u> of math and science to graduate from high school although 4 credits is recommended (and *required* for some colleges) for your best preparation if you plan to continue onto college.

Math:

- Intermediate Algebra* #1212 & 2212 9th grade math or
- Geometry #1213 & 2213 you must be in <u>Intermediate</u>
 <u>Algebra in 8th</u> (This is the advanced/fast track math.)

*Please note: Intermediate Algebra is the standard 9^{th} grade math class. If you were in one of the advanced math sections in 8^{th} grade, register for Geometry.

Science:

- Physical Science 9 #1300 & 2300 or
- Advanced Physical Science 9 #1302 & 2302



Other Requirements for Graduation

- > 1 credit of Fitness (Phy. Ed.)
- > 1 credit of Art
- ½ credit Health (Wellness for Life #1804)
- > ½ credit Money Matters (#1508 taken in 10th, 11th, or 12th)
- ➤ 6 ½ Elective Credits

<u>Remember that ½ credit is one semester</u>. The art classes and fitness classes are 1 semester (1/2 credit) long so students need two in high school (any year 9-12). Band and Choir count toward the art credit and are full year/1 credit courses.

Elective Credits: These credits *can* be courses in World Languages, Technical Education, Business, Computers, and/or Music. Or, they might be additional courses in any area beyond what is required – for example, <u>any</u> art or fitness classes beyond the required credit or additional science or math beyond the required 3 credits will be applied to the elective credit requirement.



Registration Instructions

Registration is open in Parent Portal Jan. 31st-Feb. 14th. A counselor from the high school will be at RJEMS to help students register on Tuesday, Feb. 11th, but you can do it before then if you'd like to and the counselor will look it over that day. You can go in and change your selections as many times as you like over the course of the registration window.

If you are using an iPad for registration, <u>access the Portal through the</u> browser, not the app.

Follow these steps to register:

1. Log into Parent Portal which can be accessed on the www.grthunderhawks.com homepage. Your log-in is firstname.lastname for your "Username" and your e-mail account password. Contact the counseling department if you do not know your password.

- 2. Under your name choose "Academic Plan". Here you can then enter your post high school plans OR you can choose "Next".
- 3. Click in the box of the subject and year that you want to select classes for and your options will appear. Select the course(s) you would like. If you're unsure of the course options, check this handout or go to the GR Thunderhawks website to refer to the curriculum guide.
- 4. You can plan ahead and select courses in future years as well. The plan is not final for future years (that is, beyond next year). You can also go in and change your plan while the registration window is open (through Feb. 14th).
- 5. Once you've requested your courses select "Save" at the top of the page *ignore the alert that pops up - it is saved*! This pop-up is noting that you have not completely filled out your plan for <u>all 4 years</u> which is fine. We are focused on 9th grade right now. You can print when finished but it's not necessary.
