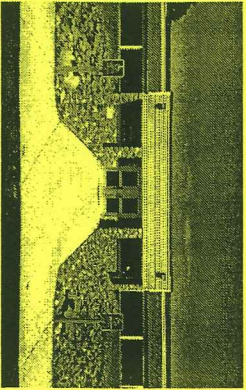


## GRALC Night School



The Grand Rapids Area Learning Center is located at 413 SE 13<sup>th</sup> Street in Grand Rapids.

### What is Night School?

Night School is an individualized program for seniors who are short of the credits required for graduation. Success in this program is dependent on regular attendance, assignment completion and maintenance of a steady rate of progress. Class is held at the ALC on Tuesdays from 3:30-5:10. Students are required to complete out of class assignments to receive credit.

### How many credits can be made up?

Students can earn up to 1 credit at night school.

### How are credits earned?

Credits are awarded based on successful completion of work assigned by our instructors. Students receive 1/2 credits for 70 hours of class and homework time.

### What is the enrollment procedure?

Qualified students need to work through their guidance counselor to be referred to the ALC. Students will added to a waiting list and called as new classes start.

### What courses are offered at the ALC?

Classes in the core areas of social studies, English, math, and science are offered at the ALC.



### Where are classes held?

Classes are held at our new facility located at 413 SE 13<sup>th</sup> Street in Grand Rapids.

### When are night school classes held?

Night school classes are held on Tuesdays from 3:30-5:10.

### Reasons to attend the ALC

- Small class size
- Independent assignments based on student needs

### How does graduation work?

Students that meet graduation requirements participate in ceremonies with Grand Rapids High School. They receive a Grand Rapids High School Diploma. Some students decide to transfer their credits back to their home school and graduate with their classmates.
