College in the Schools (CITS)

How much does it cost?

UMD CITS courses are FREE to students!

This program is supported by the State of Minnesota, the local school district, and the University of Minnesota Duluth.

How do students register?

Talk with your school counselor to create a plan. Registration happens at the same time as high school registration.

School counselors submit each student's CITS application and registration to UMD CITS program staff.

Students access their grades and transcripts via UMN's MyU portal.

Will credits earned transfer to other colleges/universities?

UMD CITS courses have a 90% successful transfer rate to other higher education institutions.



What is UMD College in the Schools?

College in the Schools (CITS) is a University of Minnesota Duluth program that offers UMD college curriculum to qualified students while still enrolled in high school.

The classes are taught at the high school by the students' UMD approved high school teacher following the same curriculum as if they were at UMD.

CITS program students are UMD students and receive a University of Minnesota Student ID which grants them access to the UMD Library, the UMD Tutoring Center, and other campus resources that support student success.

UMD CITS Eligibility Guidelines

- High School Juniors or Seniors
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Special exceptions may apply. Talk to your counselor for more information.
