

The purpose of the Achievement and Integration (A&I) for Minnesota program is to pursue racial and economic integration, increase student achievement, create equitable educational opportunities, and reduce academic disparities based on students' diverse racial, ethnic, and economic backgrounds in Minnesota public schools. (MDE)

Independent School District 318's Achievement and Integration Plan fulfills the requirements of MN Statute 124D.861 and 124D.862 by developing a plan to close the achievement and opportunity gap using revenue specific to Achievement and Integration.

ISD 318 is considered to be an Adjoining district, with Deer River Independent Schools as the Racially Isolated district.

At a public meeting held on December 6, 2021, Independent School District 318 Board of Education, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, sections 124D.861 and 124D.862, will search to approve the 2020-2021 Achievement and Integration Plan.

Student Progress and Growth

Independent School District 318 sets goals that support a reduction in the achievement gap. ISD 318 monitors student growth using a variety of academic and non-academic monitors.

Achievement and Integration Goal #1: All Students are Ready for College and Career

SMART GOAL:

ISD 318 will increase the number of American Indian students that enroll in post-secondary education from 71.5% in 2019 to 86.5% in 2022.

RESULTS:

We were unable to report on this data SY20.

According to our data, 50% of American Indian students enrolled in post-secondary education in SY21.

STRATEGIES:

- AVID
 - The AVID Elective course was implemented in Fall 2019 for 9th grade students at GRHS
 - The Site Team was trained at Summer Institute Summer 2020 for GRHS

Achievement and Integration Goal #3: All Students are Ready for School

SMART GOAL:

The percentage of students entering Kindergarten will show growth towards Kindergarten preparedness as measured by the FAST Bridge assessment from 21% proficient in 2019 (as measured by PAST) to 33% proficient in 2022.

RESULTS:

We were unable to report in SY 20, due to the pandemic, students were not tested.

44% of kindergarten students were shown to be proficient in reading in accordance with the FASTBridge Assessment in SY21.

STRATEGIES:

- Kindergarten transition communication to families for students without preschool experiences or struggling with Kindergarten readiness benchmarks.
- Transition support for students entering Kindergarten
- Provide opportunities for parent engagement to transition students into Kindergarten
