

New Math Activities!

The Only Material Needed
For These Is: Chalk!



***Number Line Activities:

Step 1: Using chalk, draw a number line. Base the range on the child's age. For example, for younger students do 0-30 and for older students go to a higher range - even into 3 digit numbers like 200-230!

Step 2: Tell them to use the number line to skip count. For example say, "Start at 3 and skip count forward by 2." They can go to 3 and make 2 hops to get to 5 and continue on. Or say something like, "Start at 28 and skip count backwards by 3." For older students say something like, "Start at 202 and skip count forward by 4."

***Telling Time Practice:

Step 1: Draw a giant clock on the ground with chalk.

Step 2: Get your child to use their body to make the hands of the clock. They can use their body to make the hour and minute hands - with their legs (the longer part) being the minute hand and their torso (the shorter part) the hour hand or just using their arms (just stating which is the hour hand and which is the minute hand to you). Tell them various times to show you!

***Addition or Multiplication Hopscotch:

Step 1: Using chalk, draw out hopscotch squares on the ground. For multiplication: write multiples of a number or multiplication facts. For addition: write numbers or addition facts.

Step 2: If you are doing addition and wrote just numbers in the boxes, you'd say things like: hop to the sum of $2+5$ (if you had a 7 in a box) and continue on with various sums. If you wrote addition equations instead of just numbers, you'd say things like: hop to the box that has the sum of 6 (if you had a box like $3+3$). For older kids, do the same but with multiplication facts!
