- Keep hands, feet, and belongings to self and inside the bus
- Keep the aisle clear
- All articles that students bring onto the bus with them must be able to fit on the student's lap in their bus seat.

Tips For A Safe Ride

Getting on the Bus:

- Students are expected to be at their bus stop 5 minutes before their scheduled pick up time.
 School bus drivers are not able to wait for late students.
- When waiting for the bus, stay away from traffic and avoid roughhousing or other behavior that can lead to carelessness.
- Line up away from the street or road as the bus approaches.
- Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before approaching the bus.

Behavior on the Bus:

- Making loud noises and using loud voices can distract the driver. Please keep noise levels down.
- Please do not eat or drink on the bus.
- Stay in your seat and out of the aisle.
- Do not put your head, arms, or hands out the window.
- Keep aisles clear of books, bags, and instruments.
- Get your belongings together before reaching your stop
- Wait for the bus to stop completely before getting up from your seat.

Getting Off the Bus:

- If you must cross in front of the bus, first take 10 giant steps away from the bus until you can see the driver.
- Make sure the driver can see you.
- Wait for a signal from the driver before crossing.
- When the driver signals, look left, right, then left again. Walk across the road and keep an eye out for sudden traffic changes.
- Do not cross the center line of the road until the driver signals it is safe.
- Stay away from the rear wheels of the bus at all times.
